## Multiple choice answers

- **Eliminate answers**
  - Some answers are obviously wrong
  - Some answers are partly wrong
  - Some answers are true statements but have nothing to do with the question
  - If two possible answers are exactly opposite, one of them is probably the correct choice.



### 3. Use the Process of Elimination

If you are unsure about the correct answer, use the process of elimination. Start by crossing out any answer choices that you know are incorrect. This will leave you with a smaller number of options to choose from, making the selection process more manageable.

#### 4. Consider the Grammar and Context

Pay attention to the grammar and context of the question. If an answer choice contains grammatical errors or does not fit logically within the context of the stem, it is likely incorrect.

# Types of Context Clues

A context clue allows the reader to understand words and ideas with which they are not familiar.

## Definition

A word or phrase that has been defined by the author.

A chimera is a **mythical creature with body parts from various animals**.

## Synonym

A word or phrase that shares the same meaning with another word or phrase.

We all agreed that the **spicy** tomato soup was very **peppery**.

## Antonym

A word or phrase that shares the opposite meaning with another word or phrase.

The gorilla is often gentle, but it can also be **ferocious**.

## Example

Words or phrases used as examples to illustrate the subject in the sentence.

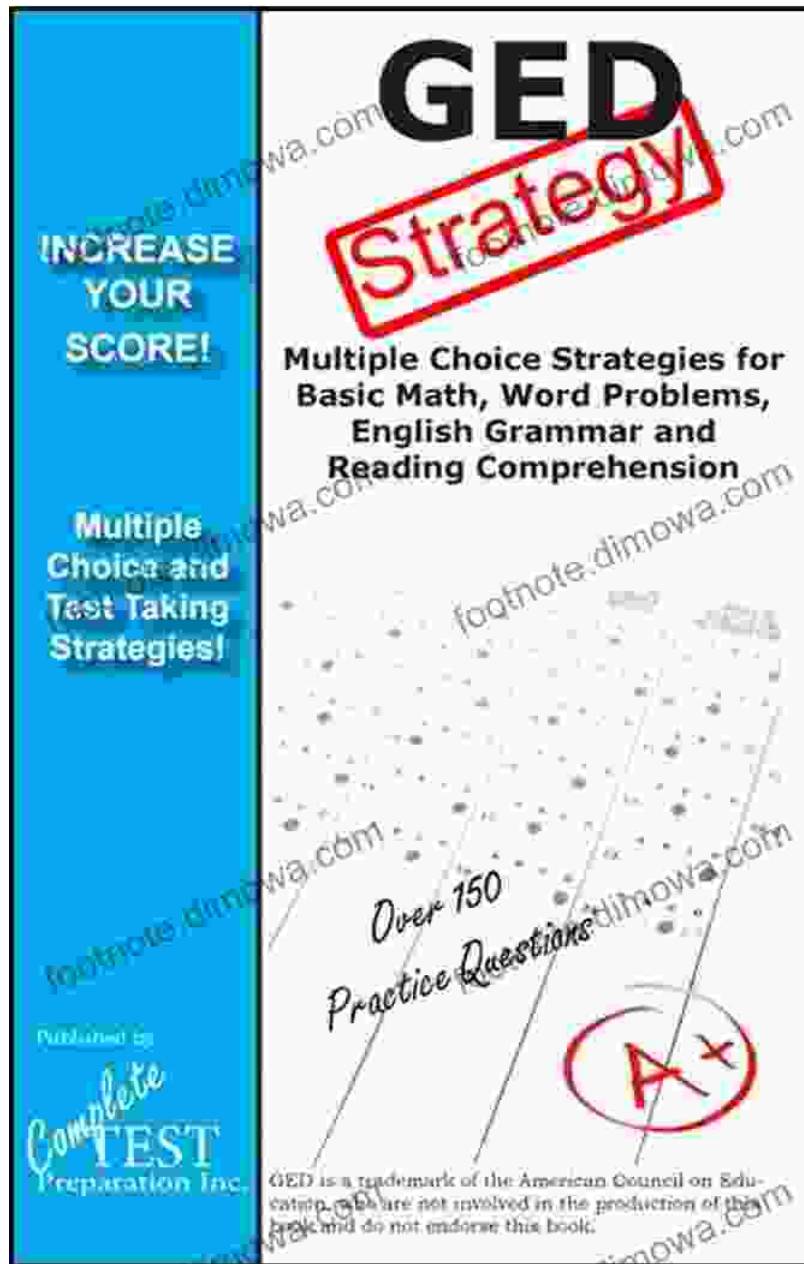
**Constellations**, like **the famous group of stars named Orion**, can be seen on a clear night.



- Look for descriptive words after the word you don't know.
- Replace the word with one you feel makes sense in its place.
- Check to see if the word was explained elsewhere.

## 5. Use Time Wisely

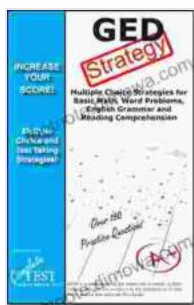
